Women and Children's Program:

The Women and Children Program is a unique service in Central New York. The program focuses on family development as a part of recovery, and is one of the only programs in Central New York that focuses on women in recovery who are living with children, or are seeking to regain custody.

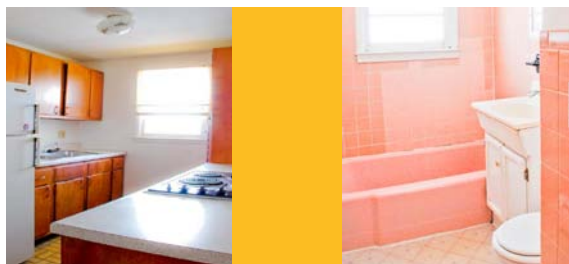
The primary purpose of the Women and Children Program is to assist in the rehabilitation and ongoing recovery needs of women and their children in a residential setting.

The program provides mothers with a highly supportive environment in order to continue early recovery services while receiving specialized parenting and life skills education.



Supportive Living:

The Women and Children Program has 9 apartments, a combination of one bedroom and two bedroom styled units. The average length of stay is between 6 and 18 months, but varies according to family needs. The apartments are fully furnished and staff are available 24 hours a day. The facility also has a live in residence manager.



Community activities include resident meetings, on campus programming and guest speakers. Weekly schedules will differ in accordance with resident's focus on treatment, volunteer work, education and employment.



Program Objectives:

The Women and Children Program works to enhance socialization effects of groups and community living. Residents work to re-establish and strengthen individual daily living and social skills, while promoting values of independence and self-sufficiency.

The program strongly promotes healthy family and parenting skills while living in recovery. The program acts as a supportive environment to practice the principles of parenting and living in recovery.

The Women and Children Program Serves:

- Women 18 years of age or older
- Homeless/living in a shelter/or fleeing domestic violence
- Chemical dependence or abuse
- In need of Outpatient treatment and/or case management and other supportive services
- Children residing in the program can be involved in the child development center
