RECOVERING LIVES





Patients who are admitted to the SBH Rochester Evaluation Center are in need of medical management of withdrawal and/or stabilization services. The staff includes doctors, nurses, accredited counselors, case managers and administrators dedicated to person centered quality care.

The center has fifteen medically supervised beds and ten medically monitored beds and is accessible 24 hours a day. All individuals presenting themselves will be assessed for substance use disorder services.

The SBH Evaluation Center is a voluntary program. Individuals are free to discharge themselves at anytime, and will be offered a referral to an appropriate community service.

An individual may be appropriate for admission to the Medically Supervised Service upon identification of at least one of the following:

- the presence of moderate withdrawal symptoms judged to be treatable at a medically supervised level of care; or
- the expectation of moderate level of withdrawal symptoms based on the amount of alcohol and/or other substances used by the patients, history of past withdrawal syndromes and/or medical conditions of the patient; or
- continued use after withdrawal services at a less intensive level of care; or
- the patient is not in need of medically managed level of withdrawal and stabilization services; and/or
- the patient is not appropriate for a medically supervised outpatient service.

Length of stay in this service is usually 3-5 days.

An individual may be appropriate for admission to the Medically Monitored Service when all of the following criteria are present:

- the person is intoxicated, experiencing a situational crisis, and/or is experiencing or is at risk of experiencing mild withdrawal;
- the person is unable to abstain without admission to a medically monitored withdrawal and stabilization service;
- the person is likely to complete needed withdrawal and enter into continued treatment; and
- the person is not otherwise too ill to benefit from the care that can be provided by the medically monitored withdrawal and stabilization.

Length of stay in this service usually does not exceed 14 days from date of admission.
